Dear CES Families,

Next Monday, April 8, a total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. This happens when the moon passes between the sun and Earth, completely blocking the face of the sun. The

sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk. The information below has resources from astronomy websites, including the American Astronomical Society (AAS) and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).

The moon will begin to pass in front of the sun at approximately 2:15 p.m. on April 8th. The path of the eclipse here in Connecticut will result in approximately 90% of the sun being blocked by the moon at the height of the event – at approximately 3:25 p.m. The maximum darkness that Connecticut will experience will occur at that time for 2-3 minutes before gradually brightening back to normal daylight levels. Therefore, 50% occlusion will occur at approximately 2:50 p.m. and again at 3:50 p.m. The moon will completely pass by the sun by approximately 4:30 p.m. Even at its darkest point (3:25 p.m.), experts indicate that light levels will be similar to dusk or pre-sunset light levels and individuals will be able to see their surroundings. By contrast, light levels during a total eclipse would be similar to visibility during a full moon phase. Except during a brief total phase of a total solar eclipse, when the moon completely blocks the sun's bright face, it is not safe to look directly at the sun without specialized eye protection for **solar viewing.** Since there will not be a total solar eclipse occurring in Connecticut, there is no safe time to view the event without specialized glasses or filters. Viewing any part of the bright sun, even through a camera lens, binoculars, or a telescope without a special-purpose solar filter secured over the front of the optics, will instantly cause severe eye injury. Viewing must only occur through safe solar viewing glasses ("eclipse glasses") or a safe handheld solar viewer at all times. Eclipse glasses are not regular sunglasses. Regular sunglasses, no matter how dark, are not safe for viewing the sun. Safe solar viewers are thousands of times darker and must comply with the ISO 12312-2 international

standard. An alternative to eclipse glasses or a handheld solar viewer, is an indirect viewing method, which does not involve looking directly at the sun. Commonly referred to as a pinhole projector, this method projects an image of the sun onto a nearby surface. Viewing occurs with the sun at the viewer's back, onto the projected image rather than the sun. Mr. Stevens sent out a School Messenger this morning to all families and staff that eclipse glasses have been ordered for everyone at both schools and will be distributed on Monday. There will not be an early dismissal on Monday, but if you would like to pick up your child early to watch the eclipse together, please notify the office at cesoffice@willingtonct.org Monday morning.

New Kindergarten Eligibility Entry Date

Children entering kindergarten must turn 5 years old on or before September 1, 2024 to be eligible for kindergarten in the 2024-2025 school year. This is a change from the previous kindergarten cutoff date of January 1, 2025. Based on the new Connecticut legislation, if your child's 5th birthday falls on September 2, 2024 through August 31, 2025, your child will enter kindergarten in the 2025-2026 school year. If your child is eligible for kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year, please contact the Center School office as soon as possible at 860-429-9367 or cesregistration@willingtonct.org

Kindergarten Waiver Screenings

If a child does not meet the new cutoff date of September 1st, families may submit a waiver request in writing for early entry to kindergarten. Please submit your written waiver request by April 26, 2024 to cesregistration@willingtonct.org. Families will be notified of the appointment time for their child's screening. Waiver screenings will be held on May 3, 2024. Families will be informed of either acceptance or denial of their waiver request by May 14, 2024.

Kindergarten Orientation and Screenings

Kindergarten screenings for new students accepted for the fall of 2024 will be held May 13 and 14, 2024. Kindergarten orientation will be held in the library for families. There will be no regularly scheduled kindergarten or preschool on May 13, 2024 to accommodate screenings. Final decisions for all incoming kindergarteners will be made by the end of the day May 14, 2024.
